IMPORTANT—Illness in School

We have had a number of confirmed cases of 'Slapped Cheek Syndrome' in school, as well as a confirmed case of Scarlet Fever. Both illnesses are usually easily treatable but it is important to seek advice from your GP if you suspect your child has either of these, so that the correct course of treatment is given. Both can impact people with weakened immune systems. <u>It is therefore vital that you let us now if your child has a confirmed case of either of these illnesses</u>, so that we can take appropriate precautions in school to protect everyone.
