Feedback Friday

Thank you as always to everyone who responded to our Feedback Friday question this week: What motivates your child to do well and achieve in school.

We love getting certificates in assembly

Pegs, awards and encouragement really motivate. If my children get a peg /award then we as parents buy them a gift of their choice as encouragement/achievement which works well for us as a family.

It was great to hear that many of the comments mentioned that the children love receiving certificates and pegs in assembly. As staff, we love rewarding the children for their hard work and sharing why they have achieved their award. In fact, we are adding another certificate to our collection. Children will now have the opportunity to receive the following awards: Wizard Writing, Maths Magician, Reading Award, Oracy Award and Star of the Week. Other motivations for children included the visits that we offer as a school, the fun learning and the music opportunities that KS2 have had this year.

Other comments this week:

One parent mentioned that they felt that the peg system was used differently in different classes. This is something that we are looking into as a senior leadership team as we know that any positive praise system needs to be consistent in order for it to have impact with children.

Some children commented in the boxes this week which is always welcome. The comments included: they love getting their awards, they love school and all of the activities and one even mentioned that they love getting encouragement in maths. Thank you children—it's so valuable to get your feedback.

Hearing parents views is important to us, so please keep contributing to Feedback Friday. We are also in the process of reviewing our behaviour system so will be sending out a survey in the coming weeks and would really appreciate hearing your thoughts.

IMPORTANT-ONLINE SAFETY-PLEASE READ

The online world can be a fun place for our children but in recent weeks we have been alerted to an increasing number of local children who have fallen victim to online grooming. This usually takes the form of someone online pretending to be someone they are not and then befriending children. The most common scenario for this is children accepting friend requests from people they don't know, often in online games like **Roblox** and **Fortnite**. Children are often promised in game currency for something in return.

We **strongly recommend** that on any game, app or device that has internet access, you check who your children are friends with and delete anyone that they do not know personally in the real world—especially 'friends of friends'. If your child uses headphones on their device or games console, we advise that you regularly check in to see what it being said and what sort of things are being discussed. Leaving a child alone upstairs on their console or device with headphones on can put them in an extremely vulnerable situation.

Please see below in the newsletter for a poster that you can talk through with your child and remind them of how to stay safe online. We will be focussing on this in our E-Safety lessons this term.
