Dear Parents & Carers,

The new term has started well with children busily getting back into their learning. We have enjoyed spending time in classes this week and have seen lots of lovely work across the school.

November is a month that always brings opportunities to reflect on the lives of others. On Monday, to mark Remembrance Day, we held a Remembrance service in school and Year 6 visited the war memorial in Radstock to lay a poppy wreath. Our younger children explored the reasons behind Remembrance Day and the importance of taking time to reflect on those who have given their lives to serve their country.



Today we held a mufti day to raise money for Children In Need,

recognising that thousands of disadvantaged children across the country are struggling to cope with a range of issues such as poverty and deprivation, poor mental health and social inequality. Elfridges and **Wreath Making** have now been added onto Parent Pay. If you would like to book either, please do so by the following dates: **Elfridges** – 1^{st} December, and **Wreath Making** – 6^{th} December.

For those of you who are new to the school – **Elfridges** is our Christmas shop, where the children get to choose gifts for their loved ones. They are priced at £3 each, with a maximum of two gifts per child. We recommend that these are for adult members of the child's family, as items are not suitable for children. The children love being able to come and choose a gift for you, and get so much joy from giving you something they have chosen themselves! We make it a fun experience, with Christmas music, and lots of jolly Christmassy helpers.

Wreath Making has become a popular event in our Christmas calendar, as an adults only event, it is nice to take a little bit of time for you, to come and have fun with friends or family members, and create something beautiful to hang on your front door! It is £15 for a standard wreath, and £20 for a large wreath, and the cost includes all materials, a drink and a festive treat. Places are limited to 40, so book now!

If you have been to our Easter Bingo, you will know just how much fun it is! We will be selling refreshments and hot dogs, and there will be a raffle on the night. Father Christmas will be visiting the school on the 4th December, and, as with last year, every child in the school will receive a gift. This is funded by the PTFA, at no cost to parents. IMPORTANT - FLU VACCINATION

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your child's flu vaccination is now due. This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. Please complete the consent form (yes or no) using the following link:

Please use the school code: WT148516

Please ensure you complete your child's consent no later than 48 working hours before your school session to ensure your child receives their vaccination.

We are visiting your child's school St Nicholas Church School Radstock on 25-Nov-24

Most children are offered a nasal spray vaccine which is a quick, simple and painless spray up the nose.

The nasal spray vaccine is the preferred vaccine.

This includes details about the small number of children for whom the nasal vaccine is not appropriate. The nasal spray vaccine contains a very small amount of gelatine from pigs (porcine gelatine) as an essential ingredient to keep it stable and able to work. For those who may not accept medicines or vaccines that contain porcine gelatine, a flu vaccine injection is available. Consent can be provided using the link above. The Immunisation Team will send you a link to book your child into one of our Community Clinics you will then be directed to book a clinic appointment to have the injectable flu vaccine.

Even if your child had the vaccine last year, the type of flu can vary each winter, so it is recommended to have it again this year or they won't be protected.

Since the programme was introduced, most children offered the vaccine in schools have had the immunisation.
