FEEDBACK FRIDAY

Last week's question got a bit wet in the rain so we've revisited it this week:

All parents and carers of children on the SEND register are offered termly meetings. Have you attended your meetings? Do you have any feedback about the SEND offer in school?

Lots of good feedback today.

Some people said they have not been offered SEND meetings yet. All SEND parents have been offered meetings with their class teachers but not all have been taken up. If you have missed a meeting or need to rebook, please do speak to the class teacher at pick up or send a message via the school office.

Some people felt more SEND support staff were needed in the mainstream school. We are blessed with a very experienced team of support staff and interestingly, we have one of the highest numbers of support staff in the whole of the BWMAT schools! Some schools in the local area don't use any TA's at all. The latest research by the Education Endowment Fund suggests that quality first teaching by the class teacher has the most impact on outcomes for children, and group work with a TA is not always as effective in supporting children to make accelerated progress. We are currently reviewing how our amazing TA's are deployed to ensure they are having the biggest impact possible.

One person asked about the availability of meetings with the SENCO. We are able to offer this and Mrs Crossen works Tuesday -Thursday if you have a specific issue you need to raise. If you wish to book a meeting please contact the school office or speak to Mrs Crossen as she is outside every morning she works. However, all questions relating to teaching and learning should go through the class teacher in the first instance.

One person has made clear that they don't find the SEND provision maps very accessible. We agree that there are some improvements that could be made here and we are investigating with the ICT team how to make this document more manageable for parents.

I feel my child's report was well written and I am pleased with the progress they have made since the last SEND meeting.

A couple of other issues raised today:

Driving on the school site—a number of families have permission to drive on to the site. This may be for a range of medical or SEND needs that have been arranged with the school as part of a plan for a child. These are reviewed termly.

Parents' Evening late slots— we know ourselves how tricky it can be for working parents to get to parents evening, especially with limited late slots. If there is no availability in late slots this time around, please speak to the class teacher about booking a different day and arranging a time that suits you. But please note—it is not possible to offer slots at a time when school would normally be closed.

Celebration Awards—some parents have asked how children achieve awards. Staff award the Wizard Writing Award for great writing; Maths Magician for super maths; Oracy and Reading for great speaking and reading and Star for demonstrating our school values. Children are awarded based on their effort in these areas and do not have to meet a certain standard. Staff keep a log of the awards given to children.
